Some believe access to water, sanitation and hygiene is a human rights issue and it's time to get back on track to adopt an integrated and holistic approach for water management.

Health and human rights professionals say clean water is essential not only to health, but also to poverty reduction, food insecurity, peace, human rights and education in any society.

### Issues In Discussion:

- 1) Where does drinking water come from?
- 2) How can we protect our drinking water?
- 3) How do we ensure water is safe to drink?
- 4) How is drinking water cost calculated? What do water bills pay for?



Arlean Hall Grants designed to help women, children and families

Is your UWF circle aware of a need in your community but doesn't have sufficient funds to help? Does this need involve women, children and families in your neighborhood? Does your elementary school need support for teachers who are struggling to see that students have sufficient school supplies, books, uniforms, snacks? Are there families in your community who can't keep nourishing food on their tables?

If any of these problems exist in your community, there is a way that you and your UWF can serve: The Arlean Hall Mission Grants are available to all churches that apply, showing the help needed and a specific plan to serve that need.

Applications for the grants are available on the UWF home page on our web page: http://www.mississippi-uwf.com Churches or mission agencies must explain their plans and show that they have matching funds to meet the financial needs of the grant. Expense reports will be required. Deadline for applications is April 30, 2025, allowing time for UWF groups to finalize plans and raise matching funds as needed.

These grants are available and designated to help women, children and families in need. Twelve grants were awarded to churches and mission agencies in Mississippi in 2024.

Your UWF group is invited to take advantage of this mission assistance.

# GUIDELINES FOR THE FRANCES PERRY SCHOLARSHIP UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH OF MISSISSIPPI

- Any student who is a member of a United Methodist Church in the Mississippi Conference may apply. The student must be at least a junior in college with a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale. The student must be enrolled or plan to enroll in a University Senate approved seminary. And the student must plan to pursue a full-time professional ministry in the United Methodist Church.
- II The maximum amount any one person may receive is \$1500 for each year of school, and this becomes a grant at the rate of \$1500 credit for each year of service under the Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church, or full-time work of the church.
- Scholarships are approved for one year at a time with the understanding that it may be renewed for a maximum of four years if the applicant still meets the criteria and maintains a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0. An update-application must be submitted for each additional year applied.
- IV Applications for scholarships must be submitted to the Chairperson of the Frances Perry Scholarship Committee by June 10<sup>th</sup> for the school year beginning with the fall term.
- V For Junior, Senior or Graduate Students Three recommendations are required. One of these should be from a professor with whom the applicant has had classes in the chosen field of study. One should be from the pastor of the church where the student is a member. Recommendations should be sent directly to the Chairperson of the Frances Perry Scholarship Committee.
- VI The following must accompany the application:
  - A. Transcript(s) from ALL colleges/universities attended, including the fall term of the present year of schooling.
  - **B.** A statement of health from a qualified doctor and evidence of suitability for the work required.
  - C. A statement of purpose: What do you plan to do when finished with your schooling? Also, give any additional information that may be helpful.
- VII Evaluation of applications and awarding of scholarships will be done in July by the Frances Perry Scholarship Committee of the Mississippi Conference United Women in Faith.
